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About the Grad Guide

The *Guide to Graduate Programs in Philosophy*, originally published biennially until the early 2000s, was relaunched in 2012 as an annual online resource. The guide compiles data on both doctoral and master's degree programs in philosophy at institutions throughout the US and Canada, offering prospective students, job candidates, and other members of the profession a rich resource on post-graduate education and employment in philosophy. This year's guide has been expanded to include more demographic data on each program as well as information on faculty, degree requirements, entry requirements, financial aid, placements, and more.

All data in the guide are self-reported by representatives of the institutions, and data are included only for institutions that completed the Grad Guide survey.

Using the Grad Guide

The Grad Guide is a useful starting point for prospective graduate students and job candidates, but the APA recommends additional consultation with advisers and people directly involved with programs of interest. Further, as all information in the guide is self-reported by representatives of the institutions, readers should examine the data closely to ensure that any comparisons are made in a fair and reasonable manner.

Demographic Data

In the survey that underlies the 2013 edition, we requested information on race and LGBT status of students and faculty. We thank the APA Committee on the Status of Women for providing the demographic data survey instrument that was incorporated into the Grad Guide survey.

There is no widely accepted standard for collecting such data, however, and the availability and thoroughness of data varies greatly. Some schools do not (or cannot) track this information. For these reasons, we provide the data we received with the understanding that this data should not be used for quantitative evaluation of the diversity of programs or institutions. Though the demographic information is inconsistent, it is included in the Grad Guide because collecting and providing these data supports ongoing efforts to increase the diversity of the profession by making existing information more widely available and raising awareness about the need for additional data on diversity.

This atmosphere starts with the departmental orientation for incoming graduate students each August - where these issues are discussed - and continues throughout the academic year with one-on-one meetings between individual graduate students and faculty mentors, and also in group meetings (e.g. meetings of women faculty with women graduate students) to provide additional support to under-represented groups in philosophy.

We admit only a small number of students and so are able to offer them a lot of attention. There is a great deal of interaction between students and faculty. We run a weekly colloquium series year-round, so students see a lot of professional philosophy in action and have the opportunity to practice professional-level presenting in a nurturing environment. Students get a lot of counseling on their careers, and a lot of mentoring at all stages, including after they graduate and start seeking jobs. We have an extremely high placement record. Our department's Austin lecture series brings in important philosophers from around the world, and our graduate students get to interact with them. Our program features opportunities for graduate students to teach their own classes with mentoring. Students get detailed and quick feedback on their work in progress, their thesis drafts, and on papers they are preparing for public venues. We have placed students as faculty members in most Canadian universities, so our students' dossiers get read by people who know our program, and who are trying to export the philosophical culture they learned at Dalhousie

In general, our department has realized that all measures that come at the faculty hiring phase, or even at the graduate admission phase are too late. Last year, only 20% of our graduate applicants were women, for example. So, we are focusing our attention on the Introduction to Philosophy classroom, and devising some specific strategies for generating enthusiasm for philosophy among women and minorities. Also, our department is home to SURG--Society for Under-Represented Groups, which holds meetings, strategy sessions, and invites speakers all with an eye toward supporting and increasing the presence of women, LGBT, and minority students in philosophy.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

We require graduate students teaching introduction to philosophy to use syllabi that include at least 20 percent women philosophers, and not to require any textbook purchase (exclusively use pdfs that are public domain, within fair use, or available behind paywall as part of GSU library collection) to help students of limited financial means. Two of our graduate students, Toni Adleberg and Morgan Thompson, along with Eddy Nahmias, surveyed introduction to philosophy students to find out why male and female students enroll in introductory-level courses in similar numbers but women drop out of the discipline in much greater numbers. This research will be continuing this year.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

With the hiring of Robert Bernasconi and Kathryn Gines in 2008, and the hiring of Paul Taylor in 2010, we have established an important Critical Philosophy of Race concentration within the Philosophy Department. This concentration has allowed us to admit and recruit 12 African-American graduate students since 2007. One student has completed the doctoral degree (Camisha Russell) and two have withdrawn from the program. The remaining nine students are making reasonable to good progress toward the completion of the doctoral degree. We are optimistic about the success of this initiative. Nancy Tuana, Shannon Sullivan, and Emily Grosholz have been members of the department for a long time. Last year we added Sarah C. Miller to the faculty. Miller's addition has strengthened our concentration in feminism. This concentration has allowed us to admit and recruit many female doctoral students. At this moment, we have eighteen female doctoral students making progress toward the completion of the doctoral degree.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

The Philosophy Department at Princeton had discussions at the beginning of AY2012-13 with the Dean of the College at Princeton about ways in which we might increase the number of minorities majoring in philosophy. The Dean gave us lots of good advice that we have put into action—for example, she suggested that we feature on our website profiles of philosophy majors who are members of minorities, explaining what they have done since majoring. In the course conversations with the Dean of the College, the Dean agreed to feature a senior woman from the Department a keynote speaker for the incoming class of freshmen. In response to some widely discussed suggestions on blogs that the climate for women in the graduate programs at NYU, Rutgers, and Princeton "need improvement", the Department set up a Climate Committee. Chaired by Liz Harman, and with both faculty and graduate student members, in AY2012-13 the Climate Committee commissioned a climate report from Princeton's Provost's Office based on a survey sent to current and former graduate students. Though positive about the graduate program as a whole, and though there was no statistical evidence that women are treated differently from men, we did learn from both the quantitative and qualitative sections of the report, and from the discussions that the report prompted among the faculty and graduate students, a great deal about the dangers inherent in the loose structure of the program. The Climate Committee recommended a number of changes to the structure of the program, and to the information we provide on the program website. These changes have since been instituted. One recommendation was that the Department appoint more senior women. Unfortunately, we do not currently have the FTEs to make additional tenured or tenure-track appointments. We did, however, tenure a woman last year—Sarah-Jane Leslie was double-promoted from Assistant Professor to Full Professor—so we have improved the ratio of senior women to junior women. We also arranged for the appointment of another senior woman—Cheshire Calhoun, a distinguished specialist in moral and political philosophy, feminism, and gay and lesbian studies at Arizona State University—as a Visiting Professor during the Spring of AY2013-14. Calhoun will give a graduate seminar on recent developments in feminist ethics. This is something of a milestone, as to our knowledge it is the first time the Philosophy Department at Princeton will offer a course on feminism at either the graduate or the undergraduate level. In AY2013-14, the Department funded an initiative by a new graduate student, Yena Lee, to set up a Minorities and Philosophy (MAP) network for graduate students in philosophy. The main function of MAP is to organize workshops locally, but a website will be set up at Princeton to act as a clearing house for events run by chapters of MAP at (currently) eight other graduate schools in philosophy. Faculty at Princeton and these other schools are all involved in MAP. We purchased and prominently displayed the APA's 'Philosophy Got Women?' (AY2012-13) and 'philosophHER' (2013-14), posters. There have been other initiatives as well, but this will give you some sense of the steps we have taken.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

The department is forming a diversity committee to explore further ways to enhance diversity and inclusiveness. Our last two tenure-track hires were women, one Asian-American. We continue to seek fellowships Purdue offers to students accepted to graduate school, on a competitive basis, to enhance diversity in the graduate student population. We have been successful in some cases, though not all. Our colloquium and speakers committee continues to ensure that a diverse group of speakers is invited to give talks to the department. Note: we do not track LGBT data for faculty or students.

Other information

Tuition: Funded students do not pay the tuition shown. Anyone with a teaching assistantship or Purdue-funded fellowship has all tuition and all but a small portion of fees waived.

Demographics: We do not track LGBT information for either faculty or students.

MA: The requirement of credit 33 hours applies to those who do not write an MA thesis. For anyone who does elect to write an MA thesis, 24 hours of course work are required.

Attrition rates: There were nine students who entered the program in 2008-09 or later and left without receiving a doctorate, but none had advanced to the dissertation stage, and so none had entered the job market before leaving the program. Everyone who entered the job market in those years received his or her Ph.D.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

The Philosophy Department at Rutgers University, New Brunswick is committed to creating and maintaining a thriving climate for women and other underrepresented groups in philosophy. To this end, we have taken the following steps: (1) We have created and administered an anonymous survey of graduate students concerning climate issues. The first such survey was administered in 2012 and the results were analyzed by an outside consultant who specializes in climate issues in academia. We intend to administer this survey every two years. (2) Every summer the philosophy department runs the Summer Institute for Diversity in Philosophy. This seven-day program is designed to introduce undergraduate students from diverse backgrounds to the various areas of specialization within the discipline of philosophy, give students a better idea of what graduate studies in philosophy is about, and explore various views about what it means to be a professional philosopher. (3) Every fall, we host the Women in Philosophy Community dinner. This event is open to all philosophy majors, but is designed especially for women majors who are interested in going to graduate school in philosophy. We created this event in order to provide undergraduates with the opportunity to meet and talk with women graduate students and faculty in a relaxed setting. (4) We have established a committee to define Best Practices relating to non-discriminatory methods to mentor graduate students generally. (5) Every year the Committee on Climate for Women and Underrepresented Groups sponsors a workshop related to climate issues. Last year's workshop was on best practices for being an ally, and this year's workshop will focus on implicit bias.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

The department has participated actively in UC Berkeley's Diversity Research Initiative, as a founding member of the Diversity and Democracy Cluster in the Haas Institute for a Fair and Inclusive Society. In this capacity, we have worked to make the contributions of diversity to flourishing societies an object of academic study at Berkeley, including study by philosophers. The cluster makes available resources to hire faculty members who will both add diversity to our community, and contribute to the academic study of diversity within the departments participating in the cluster. The department makes ongoing efforts to identify promising women and members of underrepresented groups in all faculty searches, reaching out to such candidates to encourage them to apply for our positions. We have frequently applied for, and been granted, additional faculty positions to make offers to candidates who would add diversity to our faculty. The department supports regular informal meetings by women who are faculty members and graduate students for philosophical exchange, as well as discussion of ongoing challenges that women face in our field. (The group meets under the name "Philfemme".) Our department is well aware of the systemic problems about equity and inclusion facing philosophy as a whole, including philosophy at Berkeley, and we aim to be an active participant in the effort to improve the situation in philosophy for women and underrepresented minorities. To this end, we have recently established a departmental task force for equity and inclusion, which includes both graduate students and members of the faculty. The task force meets regularly throughout the academic year to develop strategies for fostering diversity and inclusion both in the department and in the profession more generally.

All admitted students receive a comprehensive fellowship package with at least two years of non-teaching and at least four years of teaching fellowship support, as well as summer stipends and teaching opportunities. No students teach classes in the regular academic year, though several each year do so in the summer semester.

Ph.D. program strengths

The program offers a comprehensive and historically informed education in philosophy, mostly within the analytic tradition, although with opportunities to take courses in, and carry out dissertation research in, some areas of continental philosophy. Current areas of strength include, in no particular order: philosophy of language, ethics and political philosophy, philosophy of mind (especially philosophy of perception), epistemology (including philosophy of science), Kant, ancient philosophy, philosophy of mathematics and philosophical logic. We have close connections, and in some cases joint programs, with other departments and programs at Berkeley, including Psychology, Mathematics, Linguistics, Cognitive Science and Classics. Many graduate students take advantage of these connections both at the pre-qualifying stage of the program and in pursuing dissertation research.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

The department's regular faculty is 25% female, which is not as high a percentage as we would like, though it is a higher percentage than any other UC-system philosophy department. In March 2013, we held a pre-Pacific APA mini-conference, Davis Philosophy Extravaganza (DEX), with 7 speakers, 4 of whom were women. Since the 2005-06 academic year, roughly 30% (30 of 103) of our colloquium talks have been given by women, and we hope to improve upon this in the future. We frequently offer analytically-oriented courses in feminist philosophy at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. We work hard to make our department a welcoming, friendly, diverse, and inclusive environment. We have a mentoring program in which each incoming graduate student is paired with a faculty mentor with whom the student meets periodically throughout the year. (Our female faculty have been especially active in mentoring our female graduate students.) We hold a number of informal weekly discussion groups, workshops, and social events for graduate students and faculty. We are aware that philosophy, as a discipline, continues to lag well behind other fields with regard to the representation of women and minorities; we are actively seeking to increase the number of women and minorities on our faculty and in our graduate programs.

Our policy is that all of our current graduate students who are in-residence and making normal progress receive departmental support (including a tuition waiver and a living stipend) typically through some combination of non-teaching fellowships, Associate Instructor-ships, teaching assistantships, readerships – for five years unless they have outside funding (such as an external fellowship). During recent years, 53% of student quarterly support was in the form of full TA-ships, 15% was in the form of half TA-ships supplemented by a half fellowship, 3% came from Readerships, 8% from AI appointments, 7% came from work-study grants, and 13% came in the form of a full fellowship for a quarter.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

Achieving a better gender balance is one of the main concerns of the department. On balance, we have much better gender balance in introductory classes than we do in upper-level courses. We are unsure what causes this, but we are committed to improving gender balance in all of our courses. Concrete steps we've taken so far to improve the situation include a weekly philosophy club where students can socialize and discuss philosophy in a relaxed atmosphere, diversified course offerings intended to capture a broader range of interests, and consciously including more women in the syllabus to ameliorate gendered stereotypes.

Efforts to increase inclusiveness

Our Recruiting and Diversity Committee addresses inclusiveness and climate in recruiting and retention of students and faculty. Many of our faculty, staff and students participate in OU's LGBTQ ally program. Our Women in Philosophy group supports women faculty and graduate students. We are a national leader in creating new hiring procedures to create fair conditions for candidates from underrepresented groups. 5 of the 15 faculty members in our department full-time are women. We have hired a faculty member specializing in feminist ethics and invited colloquium speakers from diverse backgrounds who specialize in philosophy of race and feminist, LGBT and Native American philosophies. We have developed new courses in feminist philosophy, philosophy and race, and Asian philosophies. We brought Prof. Sally Haslanger, an expert on departmental climate, to campus to offer a workshop for faculty members. We added sessions about department climate to the proseminar all graduate students take in their first semester. We are vigilant about factors that create a hostile climate for women and members of underrepresented groups.

Other information

Our PhD and MA programs offer personalized attention in an intellectually stimulating and supportive atmosphere. All PhD students and up to 2 terminal MA students per admissions year hold \$14.5K teaching assistantships with tuition waivers. We are ranked by the Philosophical Gourmet Report in philosophy of religion (top 16), Chinese philosophy (top 9) and philosophy of art (top 28). Efforts to increase inclusiveness

Hardly more than a decade ago, the department had only one female member. We have taken significant strides in addressing this imbalance. Five of our last seven hires have been women, three of these five are now tenured, and two of them were promoted to full professor during the past year. We have managed in recent years to recruit a very diverse graduate student body, with current or recent members hailing from Argentina, Peru, Romania, South Korea, Russia and Turkey. The undergraduate program has also become increasingly diverse over the past decade. The number of female majors has increased from about 15% to about 45%, which is well above the national average for philosophy majors, and the number of African American students has climbed from 5% to 12%, which is higher than the UVa average. We are continuing to explore ways to build on these accomplishments by diversifying our undergraduate offerings in ways that might appeal to a wider array of students.

The Vanderbilt PhD Program in Philosophy has achieved, and strives to maintain, gender parity in its graduate student population.
